

Update 4 - Impact of the Noto Peninsula Earthquake which occurred on January 1, 2024

We would like to express our sincere condolences to those who suffered this earthquake and other impacts which were caused by the earthquake.

We would like to inform you of the fourth report regarding the impact of the earthquake centered in the Noto region of Ishikawa Prefecture (Noto Peninsula Earthquake) which occurred on January 1 (Monday), 2024.

The latest confirmation status at our production facilities of Ishikawa Sanken (Horimatsu, Shika and Noto plants) near the epicenter is as follows.

1. Human casualties

- i) Although there are several employees whose safety has not been confirmed, we will continue to confirm the safety of all of them.
- ii) Some employees have been evacuated due to damage to their homes. Under this circumstance, recovery efforts by those who are able to go to work have begun at all three plants. We are providing support from the Head Office and group companies. We will continue to increase the number of support members to speed up restoration activities.

2. Plant damage

- i) As for the buildings, no major problems were found in the primary survey by construction experts, but we will continue to conduct further safety checks on some of the buildings. We are also confirming with local governments to ensure a water supply for industrial use.
- ii) We are continuing to confirm whether or not the production facilities at Horimatsu and Noto plants were affected by the earthquake. For those facilities that have been confirmed, we will prepare for resumption of production sequentially.
- iii) As for Shika plant, as stated in the third report, the power outage is still continuing, and we have secured emergency power and have started the process of confirming the damage. As a result, all three plants have shifted to restoration activities. However, we expect to take a certain amount of time to confirm overall damage.

3. Restoration efforts

Ishikawa Sanken has been accelerating activities for restoration since January 6, together with restoration support team dispatched from the Head Office and group companies.

We have also received many offers of support from customers, suppliers and others, and we would like to ask for their support as needed. We would like to express our deepest gratitude for these offers.

Through these efforts, we will further confirm the damage situation and take action for early resumption of production.
